Well, the Israelites finally have the Ten Commandments. We told your kids the Scripture coming up to the Ten Commandments. Then, we took turns reading the Ten Commandments from the Bible. You can find them in Exodus 20:1-17.

Can you believe that after all of the preparation, smoke, shaking and fire on the mountain, the Israelites were found worshipping idols when Moses got back down off the mountain? Imagine the most annoying person you've ever known. I don't think they could even compare to the annoyance the Israelites were to Moses! Moses got so mad

that he smashed the tablets! Afterward, and most likely when he cooled down, he asked God to forgive them. God forgave them, but a lot of people died that day due to disobedience.



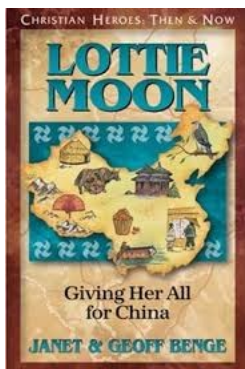
We followed this lesson with a clip from Veggie Tales—The Fib from Outer Space where Junior was encouraged to lie about a
